
Evidence Service: Spring Update

Just a reminder that the <u>HDAS (Healthcare Databases Advanced Search)</u> is being decommissioned by NHS England/HEE and will be switched off at the end of **March 2022**. Access to bibliographic databases previously available through HDAS will be via provider interfaces, currently ProQuest, Ovid and EBSCO.



If you have previously used HDAS and have saved searches on there please make sure you export them before 31 March 2022 to retain a copy.
