The rapid rise of literature concerned with “female autism” warrants critical analysis due to its implications for women and girls and understandings of neurodiversity. We sought to explore these implications, as well as broader institutional and ideological ramifications, through examining how female autism is constructed in professional practices.

### [Online Parent-mediated Home-based Intervention for Children with Autism During COVID-19 Pandemic, Caregiver’s Experience](#)

During the COVID-19 pandemic, many caregivers of children with autism faced significant challenges when it came to providing interventions. Studies done so far have proven the efficacy of parent-mediated interventions in children with ASD. COVID pandemic forced to use online platforms for training parents in various parent-mediated interventions. Therefore, we conducted a study on the utility of online parent-mediated home-based intervention for children with autism.

Critically reflecting on research practice can be an uncomfortable process for any researcher as you expose actions, and decision-making, reflect on some of the research assumptions you may have fallen into, and acknowledge your limitations. Yet, engaging in reflexive practice keeps us in check and is particularly important for researchers exploring the experiences of marginalization and oppression. This article presents our reflections on “Work Active,” a participatory action research (PAR) project that sought to improve employment outcomes for people with intellectual disability (ID).

### [Video-audio neural network ensemble for comprehensive screening of autism spectrum disorder in young children](#)

A timely diagnosis of autism is paramount to allow early therapeutic intervention in preschoolers. Deep Learning tools have been increasingly used to identify specific autistic symptoms. But they also offer opportunities for broad automated detection of autism at an early age. Here, we leverage a multi-modal approach by combining two neural networks trained on video and audio features of semi-standardized social interactions in a sample of 160 children aged 1 to 5 years old.

### [Autistic and schizotypal traits exhibit similarities in their impact on mentalization and adult attachment impairments: a cross-sectional study](#)

Deficits in mentalizing and attachment occur in the autism and schizophrenia spectrum, and their extended traits in the general population. Parental attachment and the broader social environment highly influence the development of mentalizing. Given the similarities in the symptomatology and neurodevelopmental correlates of autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and schizophrenia (SCH), it is crucial to identify their overlaps and differences to support screening, differential diagnosis, and intervention.



### [Anxiety in children and adolescents with autism spectrum disorder: behavioural phenotypes and environmental factors](#)

Anxiety is the most prevalent comorbidity among children and adolescents with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), yet little is known about the associated risk factors.

### [Screening tools for autism in culturally and linguistically diverse paediatric populations: a systematic review](#)

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) has varying prevalence rates worldwide, often higher in culturally diverse populations. Cultural differences can affect autism symptom recognition. Language barriers and differing healthcare attitudes may delay diagnosis and intervention. Most autism screening tools were developed in Western, predominantly Caucasian populations, and their appropriateness in culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) contexts remains uncertain. There is a lack of comprehensive data on the accuracy of these tools in identifying autism in culturally and linguistically diverse groups. Consequently, it is unclear whether current screening tools are culturally sensitive and appropriate.

### [A 3D approach to understanding heterogeneity in early developing autisms](#)

Phenotypic heterogeneity in early language, intellectual, motor, and adaptive functioning (LIMA) features are amongst the most striking features that distinguish different types of autistic individuals. Yet the current diagnostic criteria uses a single label of autism and implicitly emphasizes what individuals have in common as core social-communicative and restricted repetitive behavior difficulties. Subtype labels based on the non-core LIMA features may help to more meaningfully distinguish types of autism with differing developmental paths and differential underlying biology.

### [Number of autistic people in mental health hospitals: latest data](#)

The latest monthly Assuring Transformation NHS Digital data shows that in August 2024:

- In total 2,015 autistic people and people with learning disabilities are in inpatient mental health hospitals in England
- 1,365 (68%) of these people are autistic
- There are 190 under 18s in inpatient units that are autistic or have a learning disability. Of these, 95% are autistic.

### [Ombudsman's review of adult social care complaints highlights "systemic problems that cannot be ignored"](#)

The Local Government and Social Care Ombudsman's Annual Review of Adult Social Care Complaints for 2023-2024 has revealed that the Ombudsman received 2,982 complaints over the past year, with over 80% of complaints upheld. Key areas of concern over the past year have been delays in the assessment of people's needs, and a failure to put people at the centre of their care, instead fitting that care in with council and providers' systems.
